

# **Running for President in Rhode Island**

In addition to meeting federal qualifications, presidential candidates must file a Statement of Intent and collect 1,000 signatures in order to appear on Rhode Island's Presidential Preference Primary ballot.

- 1 File Statement of Intent:
  - Any presidential candidate seeking the endorsement of a national political party for which a primary is being held must file a <u>Statement of Intent form</u> with the Department of State's Elections Division between **December 28 30, 2023.**
- Pick Up Nomination Papers:

  The Department of State's Elections Division will prepare nomination papers for eligible presidential candidates on the same day the Statement of Intent is received.
- Collect Signatures:

  Presidential candidates must obtain the signatures of at least 1,000 eligible voters on the nomination papers in order to qualify for ballot placement. Persons signing nomination papers must be eligible voters at the time of signing. Presidential candidates must ensure that nomination papers are separated by city or town. Only registered voters in each city or town should sign the nomination papers for their city or town.
- 4. Submit Nomination Papers:
  On or before January 11, 2024, presidential candidates must submit the signed nomination papers to the local board of canvassers of each city or town where the signers are registered to vote.
- Qualified Presidential Candidates Announced:

  The Department of State's Elections Division receives the certified nomination papers from the local boards of canvassers, totals the signatures, and announces the qualified presidential candidates.

# Running as a Delegate in Rhode Island

1 File Declaration of Candidacy:

A voter\* who wishes to be a delegate to their party's National Convention must file a <u>Declaration of Candidacy form</u> with the Department of State's Elections Division **on January 31 or February 1, 2024.** 

- \* Must be registered to vote by January 1 or 2, 2024. Must disaffiliate from current party at least 90 days (November 2 November 3, 2023) before declaring candidacy to run as a delegate candidate from a different party (See page 7).
- 2 File Pledge of Support:

A delegate candidate must also complete a <u>Pledge of Support form</u> prepared by their political party and file that form with the <u>Declaration of Candidacy form</u>. The forms are available at <u>vote.ri.gov</u>.

3 Pick Up Nomination Papers:

The Department of State's Elections Division will prepare nomination papers for eligible delegate candidates by 4 p.m. on the day after receiving their Declaration of Candidacy.

4 Collect Signatures:

Delegate candidates must obtain the signatures of at least 150 eligible voters in their congressional district. Republican at-large delegate candidates may obtain signatures statewide. Persons signing nomination papers must be eligible voters at the time of signing. Delegate candidates must ensure that nomination papers are separated by city or town. Only registered voters in each city or town should sign the nomination papers for their city or town.

Submit Nomination Papers:

On or before **February 6, 2024**, delegate candidates must submit the signed nomination papers to the local board of canvassers of each city or town where the signers are registered to vote.

6 Qualified Delegate Candidates Announced:

The Department of State's Elections Division receives the certified nomination papers from the local boards of canvassers, totals the signatures, and announces the qualified delegate candidates.

Documentation of Approval:

Delegate candidates may submit documentation of approval to the Department of State's Elections Division **no later than February 13**, **2024** stating that the delegate candidate has the presidential candidate's approval to be identified on the primary ballot with the presidential candidate.

## **Party Rules:**

The National Committee of each political party determines the number of delegates and alternates that are elected from each of Rhode Island's two congressional districts. The Republicans will also elect statewide delegates. The rules of each political party control the method of delegate selection.

In accordance with party rules, the Democrat and Republican parties in Rhode Island will apply the results of the April 2, 2024 Presidential Preference Primary in assigning their delegates to their respective 2024 National Conventions.

## **Presidential Candidates**

## **Important Dates and Deadlines**

December 28 - 30, 2	<b>2023</b>	File your Statement of Intent and pick up nomination papers

December 30: Filings must be received by 12 p.m. File Statement of Intent to seek a political party endorsement as its presidential candidate. Nomination papers for eligible presidential candidates can be picked up the same day. Persons other than candidates picking up nomination papers must have written authorization from the candidate. [RIGL §§17-12.1-4(a), 17-12.1-4(b)(1)]

January 11, 2024 **Deadline to submit nomination papers** 

> Deadline to submit nomination papers to boards of canvassers in the city or town where signers are registered voters. Signers on a nomination paper must be from the city or town listed at the top of the nomination paper. Presidential candidates must obtain one thousand (1,000) signatures of eligible voters. [RIGL §17-12.1-4(b)(2)]

January 25, 2024 Deadline to file objections to nomination papers

Deadline to file objections to nomination papers of presidential candidates with the State

Board of Elections. [RIGL §17-12.1-4(b)(2)]

January 30, 2024 Deadline for decisions on objections for eligibility of presidential

candidates

Deadline for State Board of Elections to rule on eligibility of presidential candidates.

January 30, 2024 Deadline to file affidavit of withdrawal

Deadline for presidential candidate to file affidavit of withdrawal. [RIGL §17-12.1-4(e)]

February 13, 2024 Deadline to file documentation of approval

> Deadline to file documentation in writing from presidential candidate regarding which delegate candidates are affiliated with said presidential candidate. [RIGL §17-12.1-7(a)]

February 14, 2024 at 5 p.m. Ballot placement lottery

# **Delegate Candidates**

## **Important Dates and Deadlines**

If you are a delegate candidate affiliated with a political party other than the party in which you wish to run, you must disaffiliate by this time. Deadline depends on date you file your Declaration of Candidacy. [RIGL §17-14-1.1]

**January 1- 2, 2024** Deadline to register to vote\*

> Deadline for delegate candidates to register to vote in order to be eligible to file a Declaration of Candidacy. Registration deadline depends on date you file your Declaration of Candidacy. [RIGL §17-14-1.2]

File Declaration of Candidacy and Pledge of Support form January 31 -

Declaration of Candidacy filing period. At the same time as the Declaration of Candidacy **February 1, 2024** 

is filed, you must file the appropriate Pledge of Support form. [RIGL §17-12.1-3]

February 1, 2024 -Pick up nomination papers

Nomination papers can be picked up the day after filing your Declaration of Candidacy. **February 2, 2024** 

Persons other than candidates picking up nomination papers must have written

authorization from the candidate. [RIGL §17-12.1-5]

**February 6, 2024** Deadline to submit nomination papers

> Deadline to submit nomination papers to local boards of canvassers in the city or town where signers are registered voters. Signers on a nomination paper must be from the city or town listed at the top of the nomination paper. You must obtain the signatures of 150 eligible voters from your congressional district; however, Republican at-large delegate candidates may obtain signatures statewide. [RIGL §§17-12.1-6, 17-12.1-7(a)]

February 12, 2024 Deadline to file objections to nomination papers

Deadline to file objections to nomination papers of delegate candidates with the State

Board of Elections. [RIGL §17-12.1-7(b)]

January 11, 2024	<b>Deadline to receive nomination papers – Presidential candidates</b> Deadline to receive nomination papers from presidential candidates. [RIGL §17-12.1-4(b)(2)]
January 24, 2024	<b>Deadline to certify nomination papers – Presidential candidates</b> Deadline to certify presidential candidate nomination papers to the Department of State's Elections Division. [RIGL §17-12.1-4(b)(2)]
February 6, 2024	<b>Deadline to receive nomination papers – Delegate candidates</b> Deadline to receive nomination papers from delegate candidates. [RIGL §17-12.1-7(a)]
February 9, 2024	<b>Deadline to certify nomination papers – Delegate candidates</b> Deadline to certify delegate candidate nomination papers to the Department of State's Elections Division. [RIGL §17-12.1-7(a)]
March 3, 2024	<b>Deadline to receive voter registrations</b> Deadline to register to vote in order to be eligible to vote in the Presidential Preference Primary. [RIGL §§§17-1-3, 17-1-7, 17-9.1-3]
March 3, 2024	<b>Deadline to receive voter disaffiliations</b> Deadline for voters to file disaffiliation, if necessary, in order to be eligible to vote in a different party's primary. [RIGL §17-9.1-24]
March 12, 2024	Deadline to receive mail ballot applications for the Presidential Preference Primary  Deadline to receive mail ballot applications. [RIGL §17-20-2.1(c)]
