Deadline for candidates to file disaffiliation: March 24, 25, and 26



Deadline for candidates to register to vote: May 23, 24, and 25



Declaration of Candidacy filing period: June 22, 23, and 24.

Must be received no later than **4 p.m. on June 24.**

Deadline to register to vote/disaffiliate: Monday, August 10



Deadline to apply for a mail ballot: Wednesday, August 19



Early voting and emergency mail ballot period:

Deadline to register to vote: Sunday, October 4

Primary and Election Day Polling Place Hours

Opening Times of Polls

The polls in all cities and towns in Rhode Island will open at 7 a.m., with the exception of New Shoreham, which will open at 9 a.m.

Closing Times of Polls

The polls in all cities and towns in Rhode Island will remain open for voting until 8 p.m. Any person eligible to vote who is in line at 8 p.m. will be allowed to cast their vote before the polls close.



Early Voting

Early voting takes place at a location designated by the city or town in the 20 days leading up to a primary or election.

2026 Election Calendar and Explanations

March 24, 25, and 26

Deadline to file disaffiliation - candidates

Deadline to file disaffiliation to run as a candidate. If you wish to run as a candidate and are affiliated with a political party other than the party in which you wish to run, you must disaffiliate by this time. Deadline depends on date you file your Declaration of Candidacy.

[RIGL §[17-14-1.1](#)]

May 23, 24, and 25

Deadline to register to vote - candidates

Deadline for candidates to register to vote in order to be eligible to file a Declaration of Candidacy. Persons must be registered to vote at least 30 days before filing their Declaration of Candidacy. [RIGL §[17-14-1.2\(a\)](#)]

File declaration on:

June 22

June 23

Register to vote by:

May 23

June 22, 23, and 24

Must be received no later than **4 p.m. on June 24.**

Declaration of Candidacy filing period

Dates for filing declarations to be candidates in primaries or to be independent candidates in the general election. Candidates for federal and statewide office file with the RI Department of State Elections Division. Candidates for general assembly, local offices, Democratic State Committee, district committees, and local committees file with local boards of canvassers where the candidate is registered to vote.

June 25

Deadline to submit party nominations

For any state office for which no primary nomination has been made and any local office for which no nomination has been made by any authorized city, town, ward, or district committee or any duly authorized subcommittee, state committees of political parties may file party nominations within 24 hours of the deadline for the filing of declarations of candidacy in the same location where the individual nominated would have filed their declaration of candidacy for such office.

June 25

Deadline to file district committee endorsements

District committees file with local boards of canvassers lists of candidates having district committee endorsement (senatorial and representative district committees from the city of Providence file with the RI Department of State Elections Division). To be filed not later than the day after the final day for filing declarations of candidacy. [RIGL §[17-12-11\(b\)\(2\)\(c\)](#)]

June 25

Deadline to file City/Town/Ward committee endorsements

City, town, and ward committees file with local boards of canvassers lists of local candidates having committee endorsements. To be filed not later than the day after the final day for filing declarations of candidacy.

[RIGL §[17-12-11](#)]

June 26

Deadline to file state committee endorsements

State committee notifies the RI Department of State Elections Division of the endorsement of candidates to be voted statewide and by congressional district. To be filed not later than the second day after the final day for filing declarations of candidacy.

State committee to file with local boards of canvassers lists of candidates having committee endorsement when city, town, or district committees failed or neglected to do so. To be filed within 24 hours after city, town, or district committees have failed to endorse. [RIGL §[17-12-4](#)]

June 30

Pick up nomination papers

First day nomination papers are available. Candidates for federal and statewide office (or their designees) obtain nomination papers from the RI Department of State Elections Division. Candidates (or their designees) for the following offices from the city of Providence obtain their nomination papers from the RI Department of State Elections Division: senator, representative, Democratic State Committee, and senatorial and representative district committees.

All other general assembly, local office, Democratic State Committee, district committee, and local committee candidates obtain nomination papers from local boards of canvassers where they filed their declaration of candidacy. Local board prepares nomination papers within two (2) business days of the final day of filing endorsements.

Persons other than candidates picking up nomination papers from the RI Department of State Elections Division (148 W. River Street, Providence, RI) must have written authorization from the candidate. [RIGL §[17-14-4\(a\)\(c\)](#)]

July 10

Deadline to submit nomination papers

All candidates (or their designees) file completed nomination papers with local boards of canvassers. To be filed on or before the 60th day before the primary. [RIGL §[17-14-11](#)]

July 13

Deadline to file objections to candidates - local offices

Final date to file objections to eligibility of candidates or sufficiency of nomination papers for local offices. Objections to be filed with the local board of canvassers the next business day after the final date for filing nomination papers. [RIGL §[17-14-13](#)]

July 13

Deadline to file withdrawals of candidacy - local offices

Final date for local candidates to file withdrawals of candidacy. To be filed where nomination papers were filed. Note: in the event an objection has been filed, withdrawal to be filed within 24 hours of decision. [RIGL §[17-14-15](#)]

- August 19** **Deadline to submit Braille or tactile mail ballot applications**
Final date for those voters who are blind, visually impaired, or disabled to request a Braille or a tactile primary mail ballot from their local board of canvassers. [RIGL §[17-19-8.1\(b\)](#)]
- August 19** **Deadline to canvass voter lists**
Local boards of canvassers are to canvass and correct voting lists before the 20th day prior to primaries (20th day is August 20 – must be done before this date). [RIGL §[17-10-5\(a\)](#)]
- August 20** **Deadline to post final voting lists - primaries**
Local boards of canvassers to post final corrected copies of voting lists for primaries. [RIGL §§[17-10-5\(a\)](#), [17-10-14](#)]
- August 20** **Early voting and emergency mail ballot period begins**
Period begins for voters to vote early at a location designated by their city or town. Early voting period ends on September 8 at 4 p.m. [RIGL §[17-20-2.2](#)]

Period begins for voters to apply for an emergency mail ballot with their local board of canvassers if they need to request a mail ballot after the August 19 mail ballot application deadline. Emergency mail ballot period ends on September 8 at 4 p.m. [RIGL §[17-20-2.2\(a\);\(b\)](#)]
- August 24** **Deadline to certify mail ballot applications**
Final day for local boards of canvassers to certify mail ballot applications to the RI Department of State Elections Division (not later than 18 days prior to the primaries, or within seven (7) days of receipt, whichever occurs first). [RIGL §[17-20-10\(c\)](#)]
- August 31** **Appointment of party officials - primaries**
Local boards of canvassers to appoint watchers, checkers, and runners for primaries. Appointments to be made from lists provided by city and town party committees at least ten (10) days prior to the primaries. [RIGL §[17-15-13\(c\)](#)]
- September 1** **Post notice - primaries**
Local boards of canvassers to post notice of primaries in each voting district. To be done at least eight (8) days prior to primaries. Local boards of canvassers may substitute posting of notices by publication in the newspaper. [RIGL §[17-15-17](#)]
- September 8 at 4 p.m.** **Early voting and emergency mail ballot period ends**
Period ends for voters to vote early at a location designated by their city or town. [RIGL §[17-20-2.2](#)]

Period ends for voters to apply for an emergency mail ballot with their local board of canvassers if they need to request a mail ballot after the August 19 mail ballot application deadline. [RIGL §§[17-1-7](#), [17-20-2.2\(a\);\(b\)](#)]

- September 9** **PARTY PRIMARIES**
[RIGL §[17-15-1](#)]
- September 9 at 8 p.m.** **Deadline to receive mail ballots**
Final date for receipt of mail ballots by State Board of Elections for primaries. Must be received by the State Board of Elections at 2000 Plainfield Pike, Cranston, RI 02921 or in an authorized elections drop box not later than 8 p.m. [RIGL §[17-20-16](#)]
- September 10** **Tabulation of returns**
Local boards of canvassers to meet and tabulate city and town primary returns as the case may be, and announce results. Certificates of nomination or election not to be issued until expiration of period for requesting a recount, and if a recount is requested, following decision thereon. [RIGL §[17-15-30\(a\)](#)]
- September 10 by 4 p.m.** **Deadline to submit recount requests**
Final date for candidates to request State Board of Elections to conduct a recount of votes cast at a specific voting location or locations, or for filing other protests concerning the primary. Must be filed not later than the day following the primaries. [RIGL §[17-15-34](#)]
- September 11** **Deadline to fill vacancies**
Final date for filling vacancies caused whenever a nominee of a recognized political party removes themselves from the jurisdiction of the district or as a candidate for the office for which the nominee seeks election. In the event of death, the vacancy can be filled at anytime. Vacancies must be filled at the same location where the individual would have filed their declaration of candidacy. [RIGL §[17-15-38\(a\)](#)]
- September 11** **Local candidates certification**
Local boards of canvassers to certify to the RI Department of State Elections Division the names of candidates for each local office and the party name under which they were nominated, and the names of all qualified independent candidates for each local office. To be done not later than the third day following the date of the primaries. [RIGL §[17-19-7](#)]
- September 14 at 4 p.m.** **Deadline to receive military and overseas mail ballots**
Final date for receipt of military and overseas mail ballots by State Board of Elections for primaries. Must be received by the State Board of Elections at 2000 Plainfield Pike, Cranston, RI 02921 not later than 4 p.m. [RIGL §[17-20-16](#)]
- September 14 at 4 p.m.** **Deadline for voters to rectify deficient mail ballots with the State Board of Elections**
Deadline for voters to return deficiency notices regarding their mail ballots to the State Board of Elections not later than 4 p.m. [RIGL §[17-20-26](#) and State Board of Elections Rules/Regulations ([410-RICR-20-00-23](#))]

- September 21** **Deadline to submit list of poll workers - General Election**
City/Town committees submit names to local board of canvassers of registered voters who will serve as wardens, moderators, supervisors, and clerks. [RIGL §§[17-11-11](#), [17-11-13](#)]
- September 29** **Deadline to appoint poll workers - General Election**
Local boards of canvassers to appoint poll workers for the general election. Appointments to be made from lists provided by city and town committees at least 35 days prior to the general election. [RIGL §§[17-11-11](#), [17-11-13](#)]
- October 3** **Deadline to post canvass notice**
Local boards of canvassers to post and advertise notice of canvass at least ten (10) days prior to canvass. Notice to be posted not later than October 3 in order for canvass to be conducted by October 13. [RIGL §[17-10-5\(a\)](#)]
- October 4** **Deadline to register to vote - General Election**
Final date for voter registration for the general election. Registration must be made at least 30 days prior to the general election. [RIGL §§§[17-1-3](#), [17-1-7](#), [17-9.1-3](#)]
- October 9** **Deadline to post preliminary voter list**
Local boards of canvassers must prepare and post preliminary lists of voters eligible to vote in the general election. To be posted forthwith after close of voter registration for the general election.

In accordance with RIGL §[17-9.1](#), certain registrations processed on the last day to register to vote are allowed a five-day transmittal period. Accordingly, local boards of canvassers cannot prepare and post preliminary lists of eligible voters until after this five-day transmittal period. [RIGL §[17-10-3\(a\)](#)]
- Within five (5) days of posting preliminary voting list** **Deadline to file affidavit of names erroneously included or omitted from voter list**
Affidavit to be filed with local boards of canvassers by person claiming that their name has been erroneously included or omitted from the preliminary voting lists. To be done within five (5) days of posting of preliminary voting lists. [RIGL §§[17-10-5](#), [17-13-2](#)]
- October 13** **Deadline to submit mail ballot applications - General Election**
Final date to submit application for a regular mail ballot for the general election. To be received by local boards of canvassers not later than 21 days prior to the general election. [RIGL §[17-20-2.1\(c\)](#)]
- October 13** **Deadline to submit Braille or tactile mail ballot applications**
Final date for those voters who are blind, visually impaired, or disabled to request a Braille or a tactile general election mail ballot from their local board of canvassers. [RIGL §[17-19-8.1\(b\)](#)]

- October 13** **Deadline to canvass voter lists**
 Local boards of canvassers are to canvass and correct voting lists before the 20th day prior to the general election (20th day is October 14 - must be done before this date). [RIGL §[17-10-5\(a\)](#)]
- October 14** **Party conventions**
 State conventions for political parties in Rhode Island shall be held not later than October 14. [RIGL §[17-12-13](#)]
- October 14** **Early voting and emergency mail ballot period begins**
 Period begins for voters to vote early at a location designated by their city or town. Early voting period ends on November 2 at 4 p.m. [RIGL §[17-20-2.2](#)]

 Period begins for voters to apply for an emergency mail ballot with their local board of canvassers if they need to request a mail ballot after the October 13 mail ballot application deadline. Emergency mail ballot period ends on November 2 at 4 p.m. [RIGL §[17-20-2.2\(a\);\(b\)](#)]
- October 16** **Deadline to post final voting lists - General Election**
 Local boards of canvassers to post final corrected copies of voting lists for the general election. [RIGL §[17-10-14](#)]
- October 16** **Deadline to certify mail ballot applications**
 Final day for local boards of canvassers to certify mail ballot applications to the RI Department of State Elections Division (not later than 18 days prior to the general election, or within seven (7) days of receipt, whichever occurs first). [RIGL §[17-20-10\(c\)](#)]
- October 27** **Deadline to post warrants**
 Final day for city and town clerks to issue and post warrants notifying of the general election. To be issued and posted at least seven (7) days prior to Election Day. [RIGL §[17-18-3](#)]
- November 2 at 4 p.m.** **Early voting and emergency mail ballot period ends**
 Period ends for voters to vote early at a location designated by their city or town. Early voting period ends at 4 p.m. [RIGL §[17-20-2.2](#)]

 Period ends for voters to apply for an emergency mail ballot with their local board of canvassers if they need to request a mail ballot after the October 13 mail ballot application deadline. To be received by local boards of canvassers not later than 4 p.m. [RIGL §[17-20-2.2\(a\);\(b\)](#)]
- November 3** **ELECTION DAY**
 [RIGL §[17-18-5](#)]
- November 3 at 8 p.m.** **Deadline to receive mail ballots**
 Final date for receipt of mail ballots by State Board of Elections for the general election. Must be received by the State Board of Elections at 2000 Plainfield Pike, Cranston, RI 02921 or in an authorized elections drop box not later than 8 p.m. [RIGL §[17-20-16](#)]

- November 10 at 4 p.m.** **Deadline to receive military and overseas mail ballots**
 Final date for receipt of military and overseas mail ballots by State Board of Elections for the general election. Must be received by the State Board of Elections at 2000 Plainfield Pike, Cranston RI 02921, not later than 4 p.m. [RIGL §[17-20-16](#)]
- November 10 at 4 p.m.** **Deadline for voters to rectify deficient mail ballots with the State Board of Elections**
 Deadline for voters to return deficiency notices regarding their mail ballots to the State Board of Elections not later than 4 p.m. [RIGL §[17-20-26](#) and State Board of Elections Rules/Regulations ([410-RICR-20-00-23](#))]
- November 10** **Deadline to submit recount requests - federal and state candidates**
 Final date for candidates to request State Board of Elections to conduct a recount of votes. Petition to be filed within seven (7) days after the election. [RIGL §§[17-1-7](#), [17-19-37](#)]
- November 12** **Deadline to submit recount requests - local candidates**
 Final date for candidates to request State Board of Elections to conduct a recount of votes. Petition to be filed within nine (9) days after the election. [RIGL §§[17-1-7](#), [17-19-36](#)]

January 2027 **Deadline for party committees to meet and organize**
 City, town, and district committees to meet and organize. [RIGL §[17-12-9\(a\)](#)]
- Within ten (10) days of** **Deadline for party committees to file**
 City, town, and district committees, within ten (10) days of organization, file lists of officers and members with the RI Department of State Elections Division and local boards of canvassers. [RIGL §[17-12-9\(c\)](#)]

Note: “NOTICE OF ORGANIZATION”

Any candidate for public office, as defined in RI General Law §[17-25-3](#), is required to file a Notice of Organization with the State Board of Elections prior to receiving any contributions or expending any money in the furtherance or aid of their candidacy or at the time of filing their Declaration of Candidacy, whichever occurs first. Any candidate who files a Notice of Organization with the State Board of Elections prior to the declaration period (June 22, 23, and 24, 2026) must file quarterly on-going reports for all reporting periods occurring prior to the declaration period. (Note: Persons who have a Notice of Organization on file with the State Board of Elections and who regularly file reports with the Board are required to file an amended Notice of Organization whenever there is a change to information therein contained.)

Reports are due from candidates*.

* New candidates who file their initial Notice of Organization during the declaration period need not file this report. The first report of contributions received and expenditures incurred shall be due as follows:

› IF A CANDIDATE IN THE PRIMARY, the report for the period between the date of declaration and August 11, 2026, shall be due on August 12, 2026.

› IF NOT A CANDIDATE IN THE PRIMARY, the report for the period between the date of declaration and October 5, 2026, shall be due on October 6, 2026. [RIGL §[17-25-11](#)]

August 12

(For reporting period July 1, 2026 through August 11, 2026)

PRE-PRIMARY REPORTS

On-going candidates that are participating in a primary must file reports 28 days prior to the party primaries. [RIGL §[17-25-11\(a\)\(2\)](#)]

September 2

(For reporting period August 12, 2026 through September 1, 2026)

PRE-PRIMARY REPORTS

All candidates that are participating in a primary must file reports seven (7) days prior to the party primaries. [RIGL §[17-25-11\(a\)\(2\)](#)]

October 6

PRE-ELECTION REPORTS

Candidates that are participating in the general election must file reports 28 days prior to the election.

If the candidate:

- › PARTICIPATED IN THE PRIMARY AND WAS SUCCESSFUL, the reporting period is September 2, 2026 through October 5, 2026. (Unsuccessful primary candidates, see next entry)
- › DID NOT PARTICIPATE IN THE PRIMARY, the reporting period is date of declarations for new candidates and July 1, 2026 for on-going campaigns through October 5, 2026. [RIGL §[17-25-11\(a\)\(2\)](#)]

October 7

**(For reporting period September 2, 2026 through October 6, 2026)
POST-PRIMARY REPORTS – UNSUCCESSFUL PRIMARY CANDIDATES**

All unsuccessful primary candidates must file reports 28 days after the primary. [RIGL §[17-25-11\(a\)\(3\)](#)]

PRE-ELECTION REPORTS**

Candidates that are participating in the election must file reports seven (7) days prior to the election. [RIGL §[17-25-11\(a\)\(2\)](#)]

QUARTERLY ONGOING REPORTS**

Reports are due from candidates that did not participate in the September primary and are not participating in the November election. [RIGL §[17-25-11](#)]

**(For reporting period October 27, 2026 through November 30, 2026)
POST-ELECTION REPORTS**

Candidates that participated in the election must file reports 28 days after the election. [RIGL §[17-25-11\(a\)\(3\)](#)]
